The Matias **508 Keyboard™** is a standard desktop keyboard that has been enhanced to allow both one-handed and two-handed touch-typing.

The 508 Keyboard is specifically designed to satisfy the one-handed operability requirement for keyboards, under Section 508 §1194.26 (a)(2).

It offers greater accessibility for disabled users, as well as productivity gains for other office workers. The added convenience of typing with one hand is ideal when using a mouse or telephone with the other hand.

Operable with one hand

§1194.26 (a)(2) requires that computer keyboards be operable with one hand, without excessive strain or activation force.

The 508 Keyboard’s unique one-handed typing technology offers this capability, integrated into a standard keyboard.

Highest level of compliance

§1194.2 (b) states that Federal agencies are required to purchase products that best meet the Section 508 standards.

While a generic keyboard can be operated with one hand using a slow hunt & peck typing method, that is not enough to comply with the law.

Since the 508 Keyboard is clearly better for one-handed typing than a generic keyboard, it is the one that best meets the standards and the one that should be procured.

Comparable access

§1194.1 requires Federal agencies to purchase products which provide comparable access for disabled persons, be they Federal employees or members of the general public.

This means that the law applies both to equipment in an internal office setting and to equipment that serves the public at large (a library, for example).

No undue burden

§1194.1 states that products procured under Section 508 must not place an undue burden on the procuring agency, as defined by §1194.4.

The 508 Keyboard is a less-expensive version of a specialty keyboard also manufactured by Matias. At a fraction of the cost of its elder cousin, the 508 Keyboard places no undue burden on the purchaser.

This significant cost savings is made possible purely due to the existence of Section 508 and the volume purchasing power of the U.S. government.

No administrative burden

§1194.2 (a)(2) places an administrative burden on non-compliant products, thus giving compliant products a competitive advantage.

To purchase non-compliant products, Federal agencies must provide documentation explaining why they are not in compliance.

It is easier just to purchase compliant products, such as the Matias 508 Keyboard.
